Additional Ventilators May Pose a Risk to Hospital Gas Systems

The COVID-19 epidemic has placed hospitals in dire risk of having insufficient resources to treat the surge in patients. One critical resource is mechanical ventilation. As hospitals rush to increase ventilator inventory, they may be overlooking an important limiting resource: perhaps as important as ventilator circuits or even clinicians to operate the machines. function of both patient census and ventilator operating characteristics. It will help them characterize the load on the gas supply system in terms of peak flow demand, and calculates the number of compressed gas cylinders required if there is not plumbing system available. This can be helpful for planning temporary hospitals.
