

OSHA Says:

■ The General Duty Clause, Section 5(a)(1) of the

Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) Act of 1970, 29 USC

654(a)(1), which requires employers to furnish to each

worker "employment and a place of employment, which

are free from recognized hazards that are causing or are

likely to cause death or serious physical harm."

OSHA COVID-19 REQUIREMENTS

OSHA's Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) standards: using gloves, eye and face protection, and respiratory protection when job hazards warrant it.

Respirators = Respiratory PROGRAM!



Inspection Process

Hazard Assessments: use of Hierarchy of Controls!

Protocols for PPE

Respiratory protection program, if respirators used

Training Documents

Documentation of purchase and provide adequate PPE

- 29 CFR § 1910.1020, Access to Employee Exposure and Medical Records.
- Section 5(a)(1), General Duty Clause



OSHA Recordkeeping

Evidence that a COVID-19 illness was contracted at work. ... if there is no other alternative explanation , other than:

- 1. Workers work closely Together
- 2.Illness occurred shortly after <u>lengthy</u>, <u>close exposure</u> to a particular customer or co-worker with COVID-19
- 3. Employee's job duties have frequent, close exposure to the general public in an area with ongoing community transmission

NOT WORK RELATED IF:

Only worker to contract COVID-19 in her vicinity and job duties do not include frequent contact with general public

if employee closely and frequently associates with someone who is

- 1. Has COVID-19
- 2. Not a coworker
- 3. exposes the employee during the period the person is infectious
